



”Broderist's Voodoo Needle Cushion”

A cross-stitch embroidery from Broderist.com



Here, you can collect ALL your needles while also letting out any built-up anger!



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What's needed:

- 2 pieces of linen, approximately 15 x 15 cm
- 1 blunt-ended embroidery needle, size 24
- 2 skeins of DMC embroidery thread (black and yellow)
- Pattern

The finished size of the needle cushion is approximately 10 x 10 cm

You will need to provide your own stuffing. You can use teddy bear stuffing, batting, or similar. Be aware that colored stuffing may show through the fabric.

Tip for the embroidery:

The ugly face is stitched with running stitches, and it is recommended to use 1 thread!

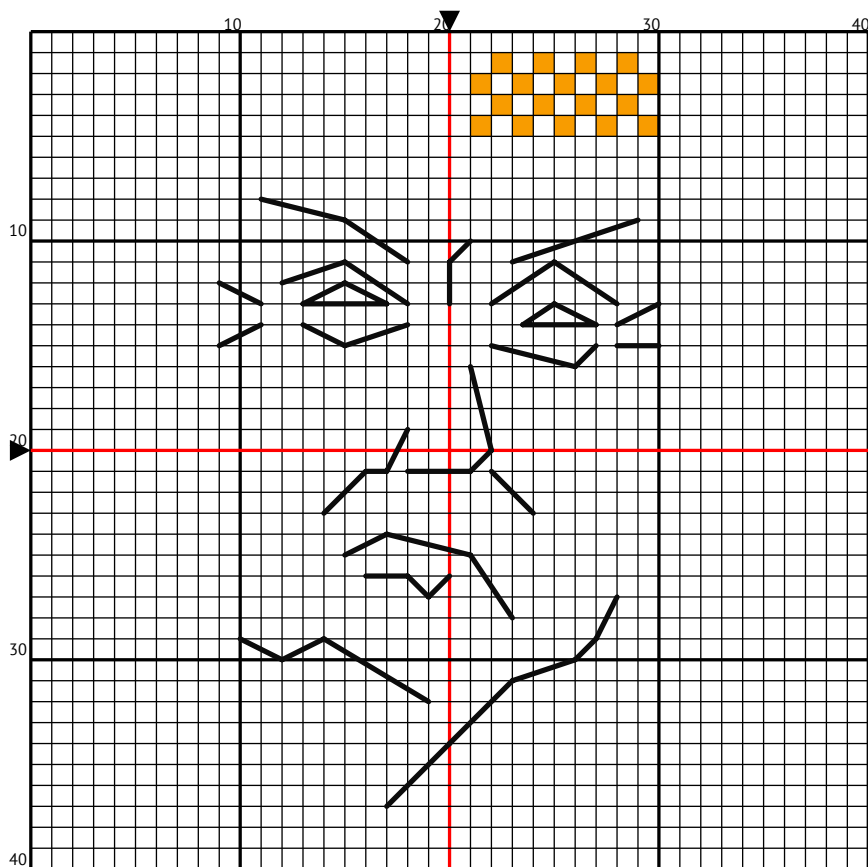
The even uglier hair is made by tying a knot in the thread, pulling it through the fabric from the back, and cutting it to about 5 cm in length. Do this as many times as you like. The thread is not fastened, but it cannot be pulled out because there's a knot on the back. Make a whole bunch of them very close to each other.

Finally, you can have fun styling the ugly hair. No hairdresser training required!

Tip for assembly:

Place the two pieces of fabric together, right sides facing each other, and sew three of the edges together either by machine or by hand.

Now turn the fabric inside out and stuff the cushion. Finally, fold the fabric edges of the opening inward and sew the last side closed by hand.



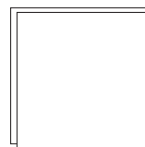
Thread splitting:



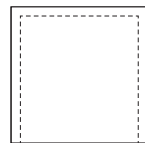
Running Stitch



Sewing Instructions



Place the two fabric pieces together, right sides facing each other.



Sew three of the edges together by machine or by hand



Finally, fold the fabric edges of the opening inward and sew the last side closed by hand
